Napoleon at Osterode: The Medal That Marked a Nation's Revival By Mike Rosik

The 1807 "Napoleon I at Osterode" silver medal commemorates a pivotal moment in the Napoleonic Wars, marking Napoleon's winter headquarters in Osterode (modern-day Ostróda, Poland) and the strategic regrouping that led to his victory at Friedland. This medal captures not just a military campaign, but a moment that reshaped European geopolitics.

After the brutal Battle of Eylau in February 1807, Napoleon's army was battered and struggling through the harsh winter. Seeking a place to regroup, he set up his headquarters in a castle in Osterode (now Ostróda, Poland). There, he rebuilt his forces, reorganized supply lines, and prepared for his next major battle. His efforts paid off in June 1807, when he won a decisive victory at Friedland. This forced Tsar Alexander I of Russia into peace talks, leading to the Treaty of Tilsit (July 7-9,

1807), which ended the war between France, Russia, and Prussia.

One of the treaty's key outcomes was the creation of the Duchy of Warsaw, a French-backed Polish state formed from lands taken from Prussia. While under Napoleon's influence, it represented a revival of Polish sovereignty and introduced groundbreaking legal reforms, including the abolition of serfdom and a new constitution that modernized the nation.

The "Napoleon I at Osterode" medal features Napoleon on the obverse and Tsar Alexander I on the reverse, symbolizing the power shifts of the time. As a collectible piece, this medal represents far more than a temporary French occupation. It commemorates the resilience of the Polish people, the fight for sovereignty, and the gradual move toward social justice—a legacy that continues to resonate in Polish history today.

Hubert,

The photo that you have sent to Dr. Mark Benvenuto for Identification is a very corroded example.

It is penny of Albrecht Hohenzollern 1525-1568 also the last Grand Master of the Teutonic Order.

He was the Nephew of the Polish King Sigismund I the Old and a fief of the King of Poland after establishment of Prussian Dukes in place of the Teutonic Order.

There are three different varieties of this Prussian Penny.

First variety is between 22 to 24 mm in silver struck at the Krolewiec Mint from 1529 to 1540.

Second variety is between 23 to 24 mm in silver struck at the Krolewiec Mint from 1541 to 1543.

Third variety is between 22.5 to 23 mm in silver struck at the Krolewiec Mint from 1544 to 1548.
