The Last of the Classics? – Finding a 1936 Buffalo Nickel in Change, in 2025

PANS club members have in common a love of Polish numismatics, but also all probably share a fondness for finding a coin that is a real winner, and plucking it from change. Many of us probably have our relatives and friends keeping an eye out for anything out of the ordinary as well – often as a favor, sometimes as a realization that our hobby has become a real passion for us. Still, imagine my surprise when my son presented me with a 1936 Buffalo nickel that he and my wife had found in change.

Pictured here, this nickel has seen some wear and tear, which makes me think it hasn't been in someone's collection for decades – although it may have been in some change jar or dish. The photos were taken in natural sunlight, since the surfaces are rather dark, and sunlight brings up any details very well. With almost 119 million coined, a 1936 is certainly a common date among the Buffalo nickel series, and so this is not a great treasure that has been brought to light. But still, it's a wonderful little surprise, seeing an 89-year-old five-cent piece still in change.
