## Olivia Yandora Wins Bronze – Highlighting a Related Field, Phaleristics

PANS member Richard Yandora's granddaughter, Olivia, recently won the Bronze medal at the National in Speed Climbing competition in Beaverton, Oregon and is set to represent the U.S.A. in Helsinki, Finland for the World Climbing finals this August. ## Medal Honoring Pope Francis Created and Offered by Medalist Jurek Jakowicz

Pope Francis, born Jorge Mario Bergoglio, served from March 13, 2013 to Easter Monday, April 21, 2025. In honor of the first Pope born in the Americas, medalist

Jurek Jakowicz created a beautiful memorial medal honoring the popular Pope.

The obverse of the medal depicts a frontal portrait of Pope Francis, his right hand slightly raised as if bestowing a blessing, a subtle smile on his face. A papal crest is in the field to the viewer's right, and the years of his birth 1936 and death 2025 appear on top of each other on the viewer's left in incuse lettering. A facsimile of his signature follows the rim of the medal on the viewer's left.

The reverse of the medal depicts the State Coat of Arms for Vatican City, with the inscription "STATO DELLA CITTA DEL VATICANO" (State of Vatican City) encircling the main design.

The medal itself has been struck in bronze, with an initial minting of only 50. It measures 76 mm and has what is commonly known as an "antique finish." The medals were struck by Medalcraft Mint.

Medalist Jurek Jakowicz was born in Poland and raised in the city of Lodz. He was educated in art at the Government College of Art and the University of Lodz. Jakowicz later immigrated to the United States in 1985. He currently maintains a private studio in Ocala, Florida.

The Pope Francis memorial medal can be ordered directly from the sculptor, who is offering them at \$175 plus \$15 postage and handling. ### Poland's First – Mieszko I, That Is

It is always fascinating to look back to the origin of a place, a people, or even an idea. In the case of Poland, it is the man history records as Duke Mieszko I, or as Piast Prince Mieszko, or simply as the first ruler of Poland.

The rather enormous run of 2Zł coins Poland has produced in the recent past makes one think that there ought to be a piece honoring the man who got the entire nation started. Oddly, this does not seem to be the case.

During the years of the Communist government though, there were two coins honoring Mieszko, one in base metal, and one in silver. The design is the same for each, as shown in the photos here, with only the denomination being different.

The 50 Zł seen here is not particularly hard to find, or particularly costly. This is most likely because the collector base for such coins is rather thin.

As mentioned, the 200Zł is silver, and thus will always have a price tag associated with the precious metal.
